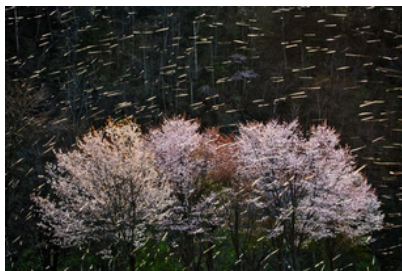
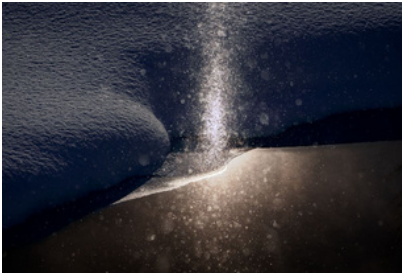

IN NATURE'S EMBRACE

with XUAN-HUI NG

Xuan-Hui Ng (pronounced Zhen Way Ing) began photographing 13 years ago as a form of self-therapy. The death of her mother plunged her into a downward spiral until a chance encounter with nature set her on the path to recovery. Its vastness gave her a sense of perspective, while its majesty reignited in her a sense of wonder and adventure. Over time, she healed. Now, she photographs to celebrate and eternalize her serendipitous encounters with the natural world.

During the presentation, Xuan will show photographs that she has taken in Central Hokkaido, Nagano and Aomori, Japan. She will talk about how photographing nature has transformed her. She will also make us privy to the challenges that she has faced in photography, and speak about how various mentors have helped her overcome these difficulties and find her voice in photography.

Biography:

Xuan-Hui Ng was born in Singapore and currently lives in Japan. She has been an artist lecturer at the Griffin Museum of Photography and various camera clubs. In 2022, she was interviewed by BBC World Service's Cultural Frontline on "Creativity and Mental Health." She is a contributor to ELEMENTS landscape photography magazine and became an instructor for Santa Fe Workshops in 2023. She will be exhibiting at the Griffin Museum in December 2023. Her work is represented by Foto Relevance gallery in Houston, Texas. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).

MONTHLY PHOTO CHALLENGE

The April photo challenge is all about black and white photography.

Shooting skillfully in black and white involves attention to all the fundamentals of composition. The photographer looks to emphasize light, tone, texture and depth to create compelling images. Developing an eye for these elements will expand overall compositional skills.

This month, we are asking participants in the challenge to switch their camera rear display/electronic viewfinder (EV) to monochrome while shooting in RAW. This allows you to see your composition in B&W while preserving all the color data in the resulting file. It is fascinating what you see in a composition when the color is removed from equation. Often photographers are distracted by color making the image more about color than composition. Look for instructions online for setting up your camera to preview in black and white via the menus specific to your model.

Take advantage of the information provided by your histogram and expose to the right (for the highlights). In digital photography the "rule of thumb" is to expose for the highlights and develop for the shadows. If you control clipping in the histogram, your details can be recovered in processing. Review your color channels as well for clipping.

For participating in the challenge, you may submit single black and white images or a diptych showing an image shot with a black and white viewfinder setting and the resulting color image.

Remember, the intention is to shoot IN black and white, not to convert an existing color image to black and white. We hope you will experiment with this technique to see how it affects your compositions.
